Re: Partial Access – OUR FILE# NSHA-2022-182

On November 22, 2021, Nova Scotia Health (NSH) received your request under the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (*FOIPOP Act*).

We understand your application to be for a copy of the following:

- 1. Data/reports on number of visits to doctors due to and resulting in
 - 1.) heart and
 - 2.) blood clot issues for
 - a.) the years 2018, 2019, 2020, and so far in 2021. and
 - b.) Please include the following age categories: under one year to 4 5-11, 12-19, 20-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, 70-79, 80-89, 90+.
- 3.) Reports, data, correspondence, e-mails on these topics, (heart and blood clot issues) in relation to the COVID-19 vaccine.

Please find a copy of the records located in response to your request. We have withheld personal information on under section 20(1) of the FOIPOP Act.

Section 20(1) of the FOIPOP Act states the head of a public body shall refuse to disclose personal information to an applicant if the disclosure would be an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy.

Section 20(3)(a) of the FOIPOP Act states a disclosure of personal information is presumed to be an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy if the personal information relates to a medical, dental, psychiatric, psychological or other health-care history, diagnosis, condition, treatment or evaluation.

Disclosing the emergency room data from each of these categories broken down by both age and year would be an unreasonable invasion of an individual's privacy under section 20(1) of the *FOIPOP Act* because the individuals could reasonably be identifiable. We have provided the emergency room data broken down by year only to protect individual's privacy.



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Disclosing the Deep Vein Thrombosis, Pulmonary Embolism, and Myocardial Infarction admission data broken down by both age and year would be an unreasonable invasion of an individual's privacy under section 20(1) of the *FOIPOP Act* because the individuals could reasonably be identifiable. We have provided the data broken down by year only to protect individual's privacy.

We will provide you with reports, data, correspondence, e-mails on these topics, (heart and blood clot issues) in relation to the COVID-19 vaccine by **February 28, 2022**.
